More Truth and Light

"The service is a reminder that to be a Christian is to be a servant. All ministry in the church is Christ's ministry." Book of Worship of the United Church of Christ

In its birth, the Christian church was a small group of like-minded men and women who believed in God's message of love and grace, and they saw their lives to be a living witness to this goodness. Through his teachings and stories, Jesus communicates over and over again to his disciples, the importance of service, kindness, grace, and unconditional love that God has for all of God's Creation.

In the early church there were no buildings, preachers, or budgets. There was only a group of men and women who believed in the importance of being servants and doing good for ALL God's people. Paul writes to one of the early Christian communities, "I became its servant according to God's commission that was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known..." colossians 1:25. Paul saw the purpose of his life and the lives of his small congregations to 'make the word of God fully known...' to all the world. This was the church's purpose, its mission, and its ministry.

How do we, today, make God's Word fully known to others? We make God's Word fully known when we see our purpose and our ministry as servants to God and one another. We demonstrate this in our actions and in our understanding that everything_WE do is Christ's ministry. When we understand this as our call, it changes how we live our lives and what we do with it. If what we are doing is Christ's ministry, then it stands to reason that we had better be very clear about the Jesus message of love, sacrifice, and servant leadership. When we understand this, we don't see that our living is about being good so we can go to heaven. No, instead we see that what is important is how we live our lives in the present to make this earthly life even better for ALL God's beloved ones.

All that we do in the name of 'church' is a ministry of Christ. This is a high calling, and from time to time we need to affirm those who have answered the call to be 'servants of the church' and to 'make God's word fully known' through our choices and our actions. On Sunday, June 30th, we have just such an opportunity as we call out 13 members of this church to journey to Back Bay Mission in Biloxi, Mississippi to 'make the word of God fully known.'

Who among us will 'make the word of God fully known?' The thirteen people from Pilgrim Faith United Church of Christ who are called as ambassadors of God's love and grace to Biloxi, Mississippi. They are Emma Healy, Ken and Libby Langevin, Alex Overland, Deb Petkus, Dan Sather, Ken and Daune Sebastian, Gail Siwek, Luke Vitiritti, Mary Weierman, Jimmy & Alyssa Werner. Each one has answered God's call to communicate through our action and commitment that **ALL** are loved, and we want to show our love and commitment to this community. Together, in big and small, ways, we'll make a difference – Pilgrim Faith U.C.C.-- will make a difference and we'll have an even deeper understanding of what it means to be a Christian, to represent the message of Jesus Christ in our deeds and actions and we have the privilege and responsibility to make God's word fully known. The prayers and support of this congregation will be a blessing to us and the work that we are being called to do.

The good work of ministry happens in real time and all of us who claim Jesus as our example and model of faithfulness, are servant leaders doing the work of bringing God's message of love, grace, inclusion, and gratitude to all the world. This is the meaning of Christian discipleship. Let us affirm our call and join together on **Sunday, June 30**th and affirm the gifts that each of us possess in order that all of us can 'make the world of God fully known..." to all the world.




LIMITLESS YOUTH MINISTRY WRAPPING UP ANOTHER GREAT YEAR OF FUN AND
